In 2023 we welcomed 4 new Prevention Specialists to the team. With more staff and an increase in grant funding we were able to expand our services to include more rural parts of the state, and to add Mpox education & prevention to our programming.



## Care & Support

Our food pantry continues to be an essential resource for individuals in the Triangle area. In 2023 we saw an exponential increase in need and served 41% more households than we did in the previous year.


When we relocated this past August, the size of our pantry space expanded significantly. We also hired an additional full-time Care & Support Specialist. These changes boosted our capacity, and as a result, we managed to serve 62% more individuals in 2023 and increased the number of home deliveries by 290%

In 2023 we secured grand funding that will allow us to purchase a new refrigerated truck. With this truck will come our new Mobile Pop-Up Markets! We plan to host two monthly pop-ups in the city and surrounding rural areas, bringing fresh, healthy food to individuals who may otherwise be unable to access it.

In addition to our pantry, we continue to host weekly support groups, provide supplements, and offer one-on-one counseling to HIV+ clients.
